The House met according to Adjournment.
 Philip Lee, Esq; from the Upper House, delivered to Mr. Speaker; the Paper Bill, intituled, *An Act for Regulating of the Militia, &c.* indors'd: Read, and pass'd for Ingrossing; and an ingross'd Bill, intituled, *An Act for Regulating of the Militia, &c.* indors'd: Read, and assented to.
 Which ingross'd Bill was read here; and by this House assented to; And the Paper Bill, indors'd: The ingross'd Bill, whereof this is the Original, is read, and assented to. And sent to the Upper House, by Col. Hanson, and Col. Belt.
 Col. Belt, from the Committee of Aggrievances, delivered to Mr. Speaker, the following Report:

By the Committee of Aggrievances, April 3, 1733.
 It being represented to your Committee, That the Clerk of the Council hath charged several Colonels, and other Military Officers, for their Commissions; your Committee takes the Offices to be Places of Trouble, without Profit; and that the Gentlemen that accept thereof, ought not to be burthened with the Charges of their Commissions: The Consideration of the Premises is recommended by your Committee to the House.

On reading the said Report, Resolv'd, the Fact therein complain'd of, is an Aggrievance, in Regard that he is allowed by the Publick 12,000 l. of Tobacco out of the Assembly Time; and that the House conceives the making out the Commissions is a Part of his Duty.

A Petition of the Inhabitants of Durham Parish, in Charles County, was read; and Leave given to bring in a Bill.

Mr. Dulany brings in the following Address.

To the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary.

The Humble ADDRESS of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly.

May it please your Lordship,
 AMONGST our sincere and hearty Endeavours for the Service and Relief of the Province, under our unhappy Circumstances, We have agreed upon the Terms, and substantial Parts of a Bill for Emitting and Making current Ninety Thousand Pounds Current Money of Maryland, in Bills of Credit, to be established upon a sinking Fund; which Fund, for its better Security, and the greater Credit and Reputation of the Currency, must be necessarily put under the Management of some Persons in London.
 And for the just and due Execution of such Parts of the Bill as commit any Management to such Trustees, We presume to have Recourse to Your Lordship's kind and tender Regard for the Welfare of this Your Province: And We pray, Your Lordship would be pleas'd to permit Your Name to be inserted in our Bill; and that We may have the Honour and Pleasure of relying on the good Success of our Scheme, by Your Lordship's Condescension of taking upon Yourself the Trouble of a Superintendency and Control over the Trustees in London, in such Manner as may best conduce to the Safety of the Fund propos'd by our Bill, and shew our greatest Confidence in Your Protection of it.
