The following Message :

May it please your Honours,
 We herewith send your Honours, the Addresses to His Majesty, and His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, sign'd by the Speaker of this House.

Sent by Mr. Beale, and Col. Herman, Col. Tilgman and Col. Ward, from the Upper House, acquaint Mr. Speaker, that the Lord Proprietary requires him, and the rest of the Members of this House, to attend Him immediately in the Upper House. They withdrew.

Mr. Speaker, and the rest of the Members of this House, went to the Upper House. The Speaker presented to the Lord Proprietary, the following ingross'd Bills, viz.

An A& for Emitting and making Current, Ninety Thousand Pounds, Current Money of Maryland, in Bills of Credit.

An A& to impower the Inhabitants of Anne-Arundel and Prince George Counties, to make the main Branch of the River Patuxent navigable, above Queen Anne Town, in Prince George County aforesaid.

A Supplementary A& to the A& for the ordering and regulating of the Militia of this Province, for the better Defence and Security thereof.

An A& for erecting a Town, at and about the Landing called the Elk-Ridge Landing, near the Head of Potapscow River, in Anne-Arundel County.

An A& for the erecting a Town, near the Head of Monokin River, on the South Side thereof, in Somerset County; and for laying into Lots, Twenty Five Acres of Land.

An A& for the Assessment of so much Tobacco on the Inhabitants of St. Stephen's Parish, in Cecil County, as will build them a new Parish Church, and a Chapel of Ease, on Bobemia Manor, in the said County.

An A& for laying out and applying Three Thousand Five Hundred Pounds, Current Money of Maryland, for the Uses therein mentioned.

An A& Reviving an A&, intituled, An A& for the speedy and effectual Publication of the Laws of this Province; and for the Encouragement of William Parks, of the City of Annapolis, Printer.

A Supplementary A&, to the A&, intituled, An A& for laying out anew Fifteen Acres of Land, Part of the One Hundred Acres of Land, formerly erected into a Town, commonly call'd Benedict-Leonard Town, upon Patuxent River, in Charles County; besides the Lots which have been already taken up, pursuant to the Directions of former Laws; and to restrain the Inhabitants from keeping any Stock, except within their Inclosures, in the said Town.

An A& to continue an A&, intituled, An A& for raising a Duty of Three Pence per Hoghead on all Tobacco exported out of this Province, for the Uses therein mentioned.

An A& for Relief of Prisoners for Debt.

An A& for Relief of Anthony Parker, Patrick Ryley, and Cleborn Lomax, languishing Prisoners in Charles County.

All which, the Lord Proprietary, by the Clerk of the Council, declared His Assent to. After which His Lordship was pleas'd to make the following Speech :

Gentlemen of both Houses,
 " I SHALL not fail to present your Addresses; the one to His Most Sacred Majesty, the other to His Highness: Nor could you oblige or endear Me to you, more, than by affording Me this Opportunity of expressing My Duty, and your Loyalty and Affections.

Gentlemen of the Lower House,
 " I CANNOT take My Leave of you, without recommending a Parliamentary Proceeding in your Method of doing Business; nor can you copy better, than after our Mother-Country.

Gentlemen of both Houses,
 " I WISH you well to your respective Homes; and I hope there will be such a Concurrence in your future Councils, that may answer the Publick Welfare: And this I recommend to you, as I sincerely wish the Prosperity of this Province."

Then the Chancellor declared, by Order of His Lordship, The Assembly be prorogu'd to the first Tuesday in July next; and the Assembly is accordingly prorogu'd.

Mr. Speaker, with the rest of the Members of this House, returned. Mr. Speaker re-assumed the Chair, and repeated what His Lordship had done and said. Whereupon, this House prorogues it self to the First Tuesday in July next. So endeth the Second Session of this Assembly, the 12th Day of April, Anno Domini 1733.
