The following Message By the Lower House of Assembly March 20<sup>th</sup> 1733  
May it please your Honours

This House being of Opinion that it will be of very great Service to the Province in General that the Circulation of the Bills of Credit be as speedy as possible especially so much of them as may Enable the People to Discharge such part of their Services as they legally may pay in the said Bills, and therefore we propose that the Commissioners be empowered to Employ Clerks as they shall think proper to Assist in Dating and Numbering the Bills of Credit at the public Charge and Desire your Concurrence therein.
