

Ordinary-keeper shall, for every such Offence, forfeit and pay Ten Shillings, to the Master or Mistress of such Servant; to be recovered, with Costs, upon Complaint of the said Master or Mistress, before a Justice of the County where the said Ordinary-keeper lives. In Page 15, Line 14, between *Money* and *Or*, put *Tobacco*. Page 19, Line 1, between the Words *shall* and *set*, insert, within Six Months after the Publication of this Act. And that the Continuance of this Act, be for Seven Years; an Act of the like Nature, having heretofore proved very beneficial to the Inhabitants of this Province; and the Want of such a one mischievous.
