The previous Question being determined, the Question was put, Whether the Officers Fees, (mention'd in the Report of the Committee of Accounts Yesterday) being charg'd according to the Regulation made by the Lord Proprietary, be allowed, or not? *Resolv'd in the Affirmative.*

*Resolv'd,* That altho' this House looks upon those Fees, so establish'd, to be too high, yet for the Prevention of any Dispute which may retard the Dispatch of the Publick Business this present Session, the same Accounts be allowed by the Committee accordingly: Always saving to the Members of this House, and the People they represent, and their Posterity, all their Rights and Priviledges whatsoever; and protesting that those Rights and Priviledges shall not nor ought to be hurt, prejudic'd, or lessen'd, by this House consenting to allow those Accounts so charg'd.

The Bill entituled, *An Act impowering the Rector, Vestrymen, and Churchwardens of King and Queen Parish, in S. Mary's County, &c.* Read; and, with the Amendments propos'd by the Upper House, passed for Ingrossing.

The Petition of the Vestry, and others, of *Durham Parish, in Charles County,* read; and refered to the Consideration of the next Assembly.

The Question was put, That this House agree to the Amendments propos'd by the Upper House, to the Bill, entituled, *An Act ascertaining the Gauge and Tare of Tobacco Hogsheads, &c.* *Resolv'd in the Negative.*
