The House Adjourns Until two of the Clock in the Afternoon
Till Monday. This house sat according to Adjournment

Captⁿ Woolford appeared in the House this afternoon

The Petition of Charles Carroll Esqr Read and the Allegations referred to the Examination of Col King, Col Hawke, and M^r Tripp, who are to make their Report to the House thereon

The Bill Entituled a Supplementary Act to an Act Entituled an Act for the Trial of all Matters of Fact &c Read the Second time, passed and Sent to the Upper House by Col Cooper and five more

On Motion of a Member to Bring in a Bill to limit the Gauge of Tobacco -
Hogheads ordered that the Committee of Trade prepare a Bill accordingly

Ordered a Bill to Be brought in to prevent false packing of Tobacco and to
Cerertain the Taxe of Tobacco hogheads

A Bill Entituled an Act for further Restraining the Fraudulent Practice of
Sheriffs read the first time and ordered to lie on the Table.

A Bill Entituled an Act to Adjourn the Courts of Admiralty vice prior and local
Provincial Court, and to Continue the process and proceedings in some of the County
Courts within this Province, and to Relieve the same for taking out executions
Read the first time and ordered to lie on the Table
