Gentlemen

This Excellency in Council having Directed the Several Justices of the County Courts, to return the State and Condition of the records of their Said Courts, and in Case any Defects appeared therein that they should Certify in whose time, and by what Clerk, the Same was made, and that they Certify the State and Condition of the Several Original papers Dequests, Entries, and minutes of proceedings in their Said Courts, the Justices of Several Countys have accordingly, made Returns of the papers herewith Sent, which being laid before this House, It appears that Some of the former, and present County Clerks, have Neglected their Duty in the Entries they ought to have made; and therefore this House is of Opinion some further Care should be Taken, and Directions given for the Security of the properties of the Inhabitants of this Province
