George Biches of Ann Arundell County Physician maketh Oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, before Levin Gale Chief Justice of the Provincial Court of Maryland, that he saw Mich^l Curtis late of St Marys County Gent Deceased and Sarah his wife Sign Seale and Execute an Indenture of Bargain and Sale to Charles Carroll late of Ann Arundell County Esq^r Deceased Bearing Date the Eighteenth Day of May Seventeen hundred and Eleven for several Mannors Lands &c^o in the aforesaid County of St Marys &c^o and also saw the Said Mich^l Curtis and Sarah his wife Sign Seale and Execute a power of Attorney on the Back of the Said Deed to William Bladen and Wm^l Hunt Esq^r &c^o 18th Acknowledge the Said Deed &c^o and further that the Said George Biches did Subscribe the Said Deed and power of Attorney as a witness, and likewise saw John Baptista Carberry Subscribe the Said Indenture and power likewise a witness, he being present at the Execution of Both.
