Resolved that all the Accounts of the Duty of Fifteen pence of Tobacco
Appropriated by act of Assembly, to sink the Bills of credit be fairly entered in
Two Books, and that one of the Said Books be Lodged with the Commissioners, or
Trustees, for Emitting the Bills of Credit, and the other Book with the Clerk of this House,
That the Clerk of this House do the same and be allowed a sufficient Recompence

The House adjourned until to Morrow morning at Nine of the Clock
Wednesday Morning March 31st 1796

The House met according to Adjournment

On Motion of a member that a Bill be brought in to strengthen the Law for Slipping
Tobacco this present year, the previous Question was put, and resolved in the Negative
