On the Petition of Charles Parrell Gent and his having made appear to this House the Allegation in his said petition This House from the constant and uninterrupted practice of the Legislature of this Province thought it absolutely necessary to pass a Bill for his Relief and as the Bill proposed by this House would not pass your House and that we think it a matter of the greatest Importance to the Inhabitants of this Province and that a refusal to Grant such Relief will be highly prejudicial to the Estates of many fair Purchasers This House therefore prays your Honours will appoint some Members of your House to confer with some of this on the Subject Matter proposed by the said Bill Signed Jorder
