

Shall any real Burthen laid upon their Tobacco or Trade we
 likewise hope that the manner proposed by the same scheme now before
 Assembly offered to your Lordships Consideration for paying all such fees
 as shall hereafter arise due to the Services Done in your Lordships Seve-
 Officers will not want your favourable Acceptance when you perceive at how
 high a rate in Current money the same are to be discharged and by so early
 a Season in each year and shall be pleased to consider that a great part of
 such fees may be paid down at the time when the Services are Done
 which will ever for such part Secure your Lordships Officers from loss
 and free them from the Burthen of Collection and for such part of
 the fees as shall not be paid in Current money (partly by the time
 proposed we are humbly of Opinion that they may be much better
 Secured by being upon Execution than they are at present and that
 such a Regulation the small part of such fees should be paid by
 the poor Sort of your Lordships Tenants in Tobacco. your Lordships
 Officers will be made easy in receiving their rewards and the profits
 of the several Offices Considerably advanced.

As the Interest of your Lordship and that of your Province
 are so Interwoven that the advancement of the one is a certain promotion
 of the other so we hope the proposals herewith humbly offered to your
 Lordships Consideration will appear well adapted to both; and as
 upon all occasions your Lordship hath ever Shown the Earliest
 Readiness and Strongest Inclinations to set and do for the good and
 Welfare of this your Province so we do not doubt but to have
 your Lordships kind Condescension here in which is the earnest
