By the U^r House of Assembly 29th April 1736

Gentlemen although we have a reasonable and just Cause to Complain of the Unparliamentary Method used by your House to suppress by Message the passage of a Bill which has received the Negative of this House in this Session and which Method can only tend to Warrent and Dispute between the two Houses, yet we shall in order to preserve a good understanding take no other Notice of the Bill sent with your Message of this Day by M^r Francis and Wilson than to send it back again with the report which is in point to your House Signed Order — — — — — Pass'd by U^r House
