By the Up^r House of Assembly 3^d May 1736

Gentlemen On Perusal of the Two Journals of accounts sent up to this House we find an Omission of the allowance to the Council of State which perhaps might be by some mistake therefore we have sent the Journals back, to your House in order to have those allowances inserted which being done the Journals will pass - - Signed Order Pass'd Up^r House

The House adjourned until to morrow morning at 12 o'clock
Tuesday morning - May the 4th 1736

The House met according to Appointment as yesterday

The Question was put that an allowance be made to the Council of State for their attendance since September 1733 resolved in the Negative

Mich^l Howard Esq^r from the Up^r House delivers the following Message
By the Up^r House of Assembly 4th May 1736 -

Gentlemen an Address having been made to his Lordship from both Houses with their earnest Desires that his Lordship would be pleased to accept an Equivalent in lieu of his Quit Rents and Alienation fines and his Lordship having returned a kind Answer with his assurance of a just regard for the Interest of this Province if any such Equivalent can be found out not too burthen some and Trade we therefore think it our Duty in consequence of those Steps not to make an Offer to his Lordship of such a Sum as we cannot reasonably suppose an Equivalent for his Quit Rents and Alienation fines and upon the best Information we can obtain it appears to this House that four thousand pounds Sterling is not such an Equivalent as ought to be offered to his Lordship in those Terms - - - Signed Order Pass'd Up^r House
