The House concurs with the Report, and ordered, that a Bill be brought in to remedy the Evil therein mentioned; and that the same be prepared, and brought in by the Committee of Laws. On reading the Report made to the Committee of Aggrievances, on the 12th Instant, the House concurs therewith; except with wh t relates to refusing of Money, said to have been tentered for Rest, for which, a Negro that belonged to the Rev. Mr James Williamson, was dist ained, and refusing to return back or deliver the said Negro, when the Money was tendered, Mr. Williamson, the Evidence thereto, not attending: And excepting also, what relates to the receiving a Pistole weighing 11. 31. 10d. for 121. 10d. Sterling; which appears to have been received by Mr. Crockett, before the Directions in Writing, in the Report mentioned, given to the faid Cro kett.

The House adjourns until To-morrow Morning, Nine of the Clock.

HE Hople met according to Adjournment. Doctor Simuel Chew, and Mr. John Galliway, ordered to attend. They attended

Mr. Sceaker acquaints them, That as it appears, what they acted, was in Conformity to In-Arn Bions given them by Mr. Philip Thomas, this House, out of Lenity to them, have thought proper to pass over that Part of their Behaviour, without Censure; but is of Opinion, that they ought to refund the several Sams of Money unjustly received by Virtue of the said Instruction, and are ordered to refund the time accordingly; and thereupon, are discharged from any further Arrendance, paying the feveral Rees due, and the Evidences Attendance.

The House met according to Adjournment.

The Question was put, Whether the Bill, intituled, An All against Ingrossers and Regrators, should have a second Reading, or not? Resolved in the Negitive.

A Bill, intifuled, 4n Act impowering the Justices of Cacil County Court, to levy on the taxable Inhabitants of St. Stephen's North Sassafras Parish, the Sum of 2801. Current Money of Maryland, at Tovo equal Affessments. Read the first Time, and ordered to lie on the Table.

Mr. Grundy Pemberton, a returned Member for Queen-Anne's County, appeared in the House this Afternoon.

Mr. Gearge, and Mr. Tilghman, ordered to go to the Upper House, and see him take the see veril Ooths to the Government. They return, and acquaint Mr. Speaker, they see him qualified. On Consideration of the Report made by the Committee of Aggrievances, the House made

the tallowing Refolves, viz.

Resolved by this House, That the exacting and extorting from His Lordship's faithful Tenants in Marcland, Foreign Gold and Silver, in Discharge of their Quit-Rents and Alienation Fines, at any Rare under the Sterling Value, is illegal and oppressive, and a manifest Violation of the right Liberties of the People.

Resolved by this House, That Philip Thomas, and Gilbert Crockett have, in an illegal and unreasonable Manner, exacted and extorted from the Inhabitants of this Province for Quit-Rents, several Sums of Foreign Gold and Silver, at a Rate far inferior to its Sterling Vilue, contrary to His Lordstip's Instructions; and also, Sums of Money, on Pretence of Fees for their Trouble in collecting, that's not warranted by any Law or Costom. And further Resolved, That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency, setting forth, the Oppressions, Exactions, and Extortions aforesaid, by the same Philip Thomas, and Gilbert Crockett, committed; and to entreat His Excellency to order Prosecutions against them for the said Crimes; and that His Excellency would be pleased to use his Endeavours to prevent such for the future.

Messieurs Stong hton, Hammond, and George, ordered to draw an Address to the Governor,

to let forth the Grievances reported by the Committee.

Mr. Philip Thomas, and Mr. Gilbert Crockett ordered to attend. They attended accordingly. Mr. Speaker acquainted them, that this House was of Opinion, That they had, in an illegal Manner, exacted and extorted from many Inhabitants of this Province for Quir-Rents, Leveral Soms of Foreign Gold and Silver, at a Rate far inferior to the Sterling Value, contrary to the Lord Proprietary his Instructions; and also, Sums of Money and Tobacco, on Pretence of Fees for their Trouble in collecting; all which, were not only Aggrievances, but tended to alienate the Minds of His Lordship's faithful Tenants: That this House was further of Opinion, That they make Restitution to the several Persons from whom they extorted those Sums mentioned, and pay the several Fees due, and the Charges of the Evidence; upon which they are discharged from any further Arrendance on this House.

Philip Lee, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker, a Bill, intituled, A Supplemenplementary Att to the Att, intituled, An Att for the more effectual Punishment of Negros and other Slaves, and for taking away the Benefit of Clercy from certain Offenders: And in An AH, intituled, An Act to prevent the tumultuous Meetings and other Irregularities of Negros and other Slaves, and directing the Manner of trying Slaves. Which was read the first Time, and ordered to lye on

the Table.
