

They might be forthcoming however in due course of Law for their misdeameanor, in attempting to disturb the

that those unfortunate People had been Unlawfully Encouraged by some persons daring enough to protest them against  
my prosecution therefore the Said Sheriff had Directions to let to his assistance in the Prosecution of this said  
Officer, Some of the Militia of the County, in pursuance of which Command the Said Sheriff was aided by several  
of that Militia repaired to that part of this County, where these Inhabitants resided, these he found there  
Shut up in a House (which an armed number of men Inhabitants of Pennsylvania had taken possession of)  
and after his demands of their being Delivered to him were Obstinately refused the Said Sheriff will the Said  
Militia Departed in a peaceable manner and distributed among them their goods for their proportion of the

The Conduct of the Government of Maryland we humbly hope will appear in your Majestys  
Great leniency proper and reasonable but we presume to represent your Majesty, that the Government  
of Pennsylvania thought fit not only to consider it in another light but to make use of it for purposes  
Deception & the Lives and Property of your Majestys Subjects for that Government under pretence  
that those parts of the Country lay to the Northward of a Line mentioned in the agreement now under  
the Consideration of your Majestys High Court of Chancery to determine whether it Should bind  
the Lord Proprietary of this Province was pleased to issue a proclamation under a Specious Colour  
of preserving peace; but really to Infame and Incline the Inhabitants of their Borders (which that  
Government then Acknowledged was filled with People of more than ordinary Spirit) to the Committal  
of Horrid and cruel Violence. — — It is with the most sensible Concern, May it please your  
Majesty that we found these designs of the Government of Pennsylvania had too soon their desired  
Effect for diverse of your Majestys Subjects who had nothing to Support themselves with but  
Their Labour and Industry were violently Dragged from their Habitations and thrown into such  
Goals to the ruin of their poor Families, and not content with these Violences an armed multitude  
pretending to be Inhabitants of the Province of Pennsylvania headed by a Sheriff and a Magistrate  
of that Province bore the Name of one Thomas Chapman who had always held the said Office  
lived on under a Title from the Lord Proprietary of Maryland, Acknowledged himself to be an inhabitant  
of that Province and constantly paid his Taxes and Quer to the same, and acted for some time  
past as magistrate thereof and in further Execution of their pernicious Intentions, these  
Pultracious People set fire to the House (in which there was then the owner his wife Children  
and two other men) and burned the same down to the Ground with all the Effects of the said  
Owner to a very considerable value nor was the Spirit of these Incurables allayed by this bold  
Violation of your Majestys Laws, but when the unhappy wretches then in the house endeavoured  
to save and defend themselves from the flames and their Merchandise among a continual firing  
of Gunne followed which occasioned the Death above, and wounding others of your Majestys  
Subjects who had been in the House then the owner will four of his companions were seized  
and carried into the Goals of the Province of Pennsylvania, where one of them actually perished  
for want of sustenance and the rest now lie. — — This proceeding by Fire and Sword  
to establish the Bounds which are now in dispute in your Majestys High Court of Admiralty  
filled your petitioners as well as other your Majestys Subjects of these two Provinces with such  
Terrible apprehensions, that an immediate Application was made to your Government for  
the Government of Pennsylvania for their assistance in disinterting such Violences and  
Bringing the Offenders to condigne Punishment; and least they should escape a just punishment  
their who did so by any doubt which the Government of Pennsylvania might prevail to  
determine of the place where they ought to be tried, this Government proposed that
