

The House adjourns untill tomorrow morning at 9 of the clock.

Thursday morning May 11. 1738

The House met according to adjournment - all present as yesterday, except Major Sprigg.  
 A Bill intituled an Act recurring to Act of Assembly intituled an Act licensing Pedlers and Hawkers.  
 A Bill giving an Act of Assembly intituled an Act for raising three pence of Hoghead on all Sallows to be exported, for purchasing Arms and Ammunition for the Defence of this Province.  
 A Bill revising an Act intituled an Act to prevent the injuring Harbours within this Province and for repealing the Act therein mentioned.  
 A Bill revising an Act of Assembly intituled an Act for the relieving the Inhabitants of this Province from some Aggravances in the prosecution of Suits at Law, as also an Act of Assembly intituled a supplementary Act to the Act for the relieving the Inhabitants of this Province from some Aggravances in the prosecution of Suits at Law - respectively read the first time and ordered to lie on the Table.

Edmund Jennings Esq. from the Upper House delivers Mr. Speaker a petition of Benjamin Howard of Northampton County praying leave to bring in a Bill to invest him with an Estate in Fee Simple in and to a tract of Land called Upper Neck et. indented recommended by the Upper House of Assembly to the Consideration of the Lower House, which was here read.

Ordered that Mr. Henry, Mr. Sprigg and Mr. Samuel Smith and Mr. Wootton enquire into the facts contained in the petition and make report thereof to the House.

George Water Esq. from the Upper House delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill intituled an Act to improve the Justice of Prince Georges County to raise levy and assess the Money therein mentioned on the Taxable Inhabitants of such County in said County et. indented thus by the Upper House of Assembly 9. May 1738 read the first time and ordered to lie on the Table - And thus by the Upper House of Assembly 10. May 1738 read the second the second time and will pass. The words, and his or her convenient warm room with a fire place for accommodation of such of his or her said parishioners as shall resort to his or her said chapel, in the 14. line of the first page be left out. Signed & ordered Mr. Speaker.
