Merchant in London some books paper ink lead for the use of the publick and the same being sold
accordingly amounting to £15. 10. Sterd when said Hyde had not any other money in his hands than
such as was on the duty of 3^d p^{er} cent. for arms and Ammunition - The House having agreed that an
Order be drawn on Mr. Treasurer that payable to said Mr. Hyde for said Sum out of the publick
Money in said State hands due to this Province admitted him by said Samuel Young, and
your Honours concurrence therein - Signed by Order Wm Macnemara &c. Ho.

Sent to the Upper House by Mr. Hanford and Mr. Thomas Smith
Edmund Jennings Esq. from the Upper House deliver Mr. Speaker the Bill entitled an
Act for the speedy publication of the Laws of this Province and for the encouragement of James
Green of the City of Annapolis Quater indorsed - By the Upper House of Assembly 16th May 1738
