

John Lode is in custody of the Sergeant attended at the Bar of this House.

Robert Newcomb an Evidence being ordered to attend, was sworn on the Holy Evangel of Almighty God, and Depposed, that in conversation on the road in Talbot County with the said Lode: the said Lode asked him which way he was going. As the said Newcomb told the said Lode, he was going to receive some Summons from the Lower House of Assembly requiring their attendance on that House. But thereupon the said Lode, told the said Newcomb, that as the said Lode was summoned likewise to attend. That he believed it was all owing to that son of a Bitch Mr. Nicholas Goldsborough, who the said Newcomb declared was one of the Members of the Lower House of Assembly. That he thought as a Magistrate in any Disorder or Mischief in his Office, he was only punishable by the Government and not by this House. That the said Newcomb further declared, that the said Lode told him that he did not know what power the Lower House had to call him before them: For his part he did not think they had any more Authority to call him before them, than his House, and were it not that the People would say if he did not attend, and that he did not value One button or Fart what the Lower House could do to him. — The truth of the facts appearing to this House, the said John Lode was further continued in the custody of the Sergeant at Arms.

The Door-keeper acquainted Mr. Speaker the Clerk of the Council told him to acquaint Mr. Speaker he had a Message from the Upper House.

Whereupon the Clerk was ordered to deliver the following Answer

May 19<sup>E</sup> 1738

I am ordered to acquaint you that the Honourable Lower House of Assembly will not receive any Message from the Honourable Upper House of Assembly before Clerk, until a Message is returned by one or more Members thereof in answer to the Message sent up to that Honourable House yesterday by Col. Cooper and Mr. Curtis by which the future Method of sending Messages by the Clerks of either House may be adjusted between the two Houses. Signed per Order — Macnemara & Co. No.

To Mr. John Ross Clerk of the  
Upper House of Assembly.

The Clerk acquainted Mr. Speaker he told the Clerk of the Upper House he had a Message to deliver from the Lower House, that the Clerk of the Upper House acquainted him he had Orders to receive no Messages — The Clerk of the Lower house upon told the Clerk of the upper house he had orders to show fit to him that he might acquaint the upper house with the contents of the Message and began to read, the Clerk of the upper house returned without hearing it.

The house adjourned Saturday Morning May the 20<sup>th</sup> 1738 —

The House met according to adjournment.
