among other things recited, That for and towards the defraying the many great and necessary Expences of Government, and to the Intent his Lordinip, his Heirs and Succeffors, Absolute Lords and Proprietaries of this Province, might for the future be enabled in some measure to defray the same, and in particular, to allow competent Salaries and Encouragement to the Lieutenant Generals and Chief Governors, and to the Privy Council of the Lord and Proprietary of this Province for the Time being, to as without Prejudice to their private Affairs, they might • be encouraged, and reasonably required to Attend unto the Administration of Justice, and other Publick Concernments: It is by the said Act among other Things Enacted, that from and after the first day of September then next coming, there should be raised, levied, collected, and paid unto his Lordship the Lord Proprietary of this Province, the Sum of Two Shillings Sterling for every Hogshead and quantity of an Hogshead of Tobacco, which should be at any Time thereafter shipped in any Ship or Vessel, to be Exported out of this Province, or any the Territories, Islands, Ports, Rivers, Creeks or Places, thereunto belonging; Provided always, that one half of the Money by the faid Act to be raifed, be employed towards the maintaining a conflant Magazine with Arms and Ammunition for the Defence of this Province, and defraying other Publick necessary Charges of the Government; Provided s always, that so long as the said Act should continue, his said Lordship, his Receiver or Receivers General, for the Time being, should receive good, found and merchantable Tobacco, when tendred, for his faid Lordship's Rents or Fines for Alienation of Lands, reserved upon the several and respective Grants of Land in this Province, at the rate of Two Pence per Pound, any Thing in his said Lordship's Grants to the contrary thereof notwithstanding: By which said Act 'twas also Enacted, that the same should continue during the natural Life of the Right Honourable Cavilius, then Lord and Proprietary of this Province, and for one Grop more next after his Decease, and no longer, as by the said Act, relation thereunto being had, may appear.

Your faid Committee do further find, that by an Act of Assembly Made and Passed at a General Assembly, held at the City of St. Mary's, the 13th day of April, in the Forty Second Year of the Dominion of the Right Honourable Cacilius, &c. Annoque Domini 1674, his Excellency Charles Calvert being Governor, Entituled, An Act of Gratitude to bis Excellency Charles Calvert, E/q; Captain General of Maryland; after reciting the faid last mentioned Act of Assembly throughout, It is Enacted, That the said recited Act, and all and every the Articles, Provitoes, Matters, and Things therein contained, should stand, and be by the said Act, Ratissed and Consirmed, to all Intents and Purpoles, according to the true Intent and Meaning of the laid recited Act, not only for and during the Life of the Right Honourable Cacilius, Absolute Lord and Proprietary of this Province, and for one Crop after ' as aforesaid, But also, for and during the natural Life of the Right Honourable Charles Calvert, Esq; Son and Heir apparent of the said Capillius, then Lord Proprietary, and no longer, and that, from and ' after the Deceale of him the laid Cæcilius Lord Proprietary,
