Eig; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker a Petition of the Vestry and sundry Inhabitants of Succen-Ann's Parish in Frince George's County: Indorsed, Referred to the Consideration of the Lower House of Assembly. The Petition being here Read, by which it is praved, that a Bill may be brought in to Levy One Hundred Pounds Corrent Money on the Taxable Persons of said Parish, towards ground ceiling sorund repairing the Chappel in the said Parish, Built by the Reverend Mr. Hender on his Espouse Deceased, and that the said Chappel may be deemed a Chappel of the said Parish, and at all Times hereaster, be repaired, &c. at the Parish Charge. Leave given to bring in a Bill, 3 and 1 the House Adjourns to 2 of the Clack in the Afternoon,
