VOur Committee humbly Apprehend, that his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary's Levying, Collecting and Raising the Sum of Fourteen Pence Sterling per Tun on the Tunnage of every Ship or Vessel Trading into this Province, (not properly belonging to the same, and applying the said Duty to his own Use, is against the Reason and the stitution of the said Duty, as appears by the Act for Port Duties and
