ful Subjects, Alienation Fines on all Lands Devised, and by Colour of which Instructions and Orders, the said Receivers having extorted from many his Majesty's Liege People, such Fines, was a Thing unheard of since the Settlement of this Province by British Subjects, tillwithin three

Years last past.

Your Committee most humbly conceive that such Actings, is against Law, Custom, Reason, and the express Tenor of the Grants, made by his Lordship and his Ancestors, of Land to the good People of this Province and their Predecessor; and which your said Committee conceives to be, not only an Innovation, but an Invasion on the Rights of the People; and a great Aggrievance and Oppression; but the same is humbly submitted to the Consideration of your Honourable House.
