We hope that this Government hath no Enemies nor will make any; and malicious private Whispers and groundless Instituations are weak Attempts which ought to be despited.

We assure your Excellency, that this House will always to the best of their Knowlege, act openly, freely and candidly, and which Conduct most agreeable to Native British Sincerity, the inseparable Characteristick of

every true Briton, we humbly Hope will give no Offence,
