We hope that this Government hath no Enemies, nor will make any; and malicious private Whispers and groundless Insinuations are weak Attempts which ought to be despised.

We assure your Excellency, that this House will always to the best of their Knowledge, act openly, freely and candidly, and which Conduct most agreeable to Native *British* Sincerity, the inseparable Characteristick of every true *Briton*, we humbly Hope will give no Offence.
