Therefore as that would lessen the necessary Provision for our present Sasety against our foreign and domestick Enemies, as well as contradict our former Resolution about the Determination of Money Bills, we cannot agree to your proposed Expedient.

You have now the Bill for Encouragement of his Majesty's Levies, in your Possession, and we have put it in your Power, by sending down our other Bills with their usual Duration, to have that for Desence of the Province, so that we hope it will not be imputed to us that they are not Passed into Laws.
