By the Committee for Inspecting the Arms and Ammunition, and Ac-

counts relating thereto. May 31. 1740.

Our Committee having viewed and inspected the quality and quantity of the Arms and Ammunition of this Province, now in the City of Annapolis, Do find the fame as follows, viz.

In the Powder House,

Forty Six half Barrels and Two quarter Barrels of Gunpowder,

In the Room over the Conference Chamber,

Thirteen Pair new Pistols.

Seventeen new Swords with Belts.

Nine old Carabines.

Eight short Muskets with Bayonets.

Twenty Eight Muskets.

Eight Drums.

Nincteen Cartouch Boxes and Eighteen Belts belonging to them.

About Thirty Eight Caggs of Shot.

Under the Stairs in the Council Chamber,

Three Barrels of Shot with about 300 lb. taken out.

In the Stadt House,

Three Barrels supposed to be Shot or Lead.
