vince, who shall, on behalf of the said Michael Taylor, enter before one Provincial Justice of this Province, or two Justices of Prince George's 6 County Court, into a Recognizance or Recognizances to the Lord Pro-' prietary, in the Sum of One Hundred Pounds Current Money each, with a Condition or Deseazance that he the said Michael Taylor shall keep 6 the Peace and be of good Behaviour towards all his Majesty's Subjects, and particularly towards William Mauduit of the said Prince George's County, for and during the Term of Five Years.

By the Lower House of Assembly, July 26. 1740.

May it please your Honours,

This House cannot consistent with their Duty and the Laws of this Province, allow the Article of 1201b. Tobacco to the Chancellor.

As to the Quantity of 54898 lb. Tobacco infifted upon by your Honours to be allowed to his Lordship's Secretary and Attorney General, we cannot allow thereof, the Profecutions which gave Rife to those Fees. being carried on to Support his Lordship's Private Affairs, and which Prosecutions have been by his Majesty in Council disapproved, and that the Allowing such extraordinary Charges may be a dangerous Precedent, and open a way to Burthen this Province with far greater Sums.

The Ferriages to his Lordship's Council we are willing to allow.

Some of the Articles for which Mr. Ross as Clerk of the Council Charges, and which constitutes the sum of 2213 lb. Tobacco, we conceive to be done partly in the Execution of his Office, and for which he has a Yearly Salary; Other part for making out Pardons, ought to have been paid by the Persons concerned, therefore conceive the Publick not chargeable, nor can we allow thereof.

As to the Sum of 1201. 7 s. 9 d. Currency to Mr. Ross, as Clerk of the Council, being over and above a Sum already allowed him in the Journal, and which has been thought reasonable and sufficient by this House sor his Service for transcribing Journals of the Upper House and Council, we therefore think it unreasonable to allow him the said Sum of 120 1.7 s. 9d.

We hope your Honours will without insisting on these Charges, Pass
