By the Upper House of Assembly, July 29. 1740.

Gentlemen, T is really high Time for us to be filent, when we find you not only I say what comes uppermost in your own Thoughts, but even endeavour to make us say what never entered into ours, or can be implied from our Words; As a Specimen of This you urge, " As if we thought it incon-" sittent with the Disposition of the Governor or Chancellor to shew either " Mercy or Lenity without being paid for the same by the Publick, con-" trary to a Law of the Province," whereas we only told you " that we were surprized you should think it inconsistent with your Duty and " the Laws of the Province to allow the Article of 120 1b. Tobacco, since that Fee arose from the Mercy and Lenity of the Governor shewn to " an Offender by the Seal of a Pardon:" Does this import that it is inconsistent with the Disposition of the Governor and Chancellor to shew
