

The Petition of *Hannah Ratcliffe* of *Queen-Anne's County*, Executrix of *William Ratcliffe*, Deceased, was Read and Granted.

The Petition of *Thomas Spalding*, and *Catharine* his Wife, was Read, and thereupon *Col. Hooper*, *Mr. Rumsey*, and *Capt. Gist*, are appointed a Committee to enquire into the Allegations therein contained, and to make their Report to the House.

Mr. Wootton, brings in a Bill, entituled, *An Act Impowering the Justices of Prince George's County to Levy on the Taxable Inhabitants of Queen-Anne Parish in the said County, the Sum of 100 l. Current Money of Maryland, for the Uses therein mentioned*: Read the First Time, and Ordered to lie on the Table.

The House Adjourns to 2 of the Clock in the Afternoon.

On Motion to bring in a Bill to lay out and apply a Sum not exceeding Pounds Current Money, for the Repairs necessary to be made to the Council House, the Stadt-House, and the Parade, in *Annapolis*; Leave given, and Ordered, that the Committee of Laws prepare and bring the Bill in accordingly.

The House Adjourns until to Morrow Morning at 9 of the Clock.
