Read the First Time, and Ordered to lie on the Table.

Col. Hooper, from the Committee appointed to enquire into the Allegations contained in Joseph Williams's Petition, delivers Mr. Speaker the

following Report:

By the Committee appointed to Enquire into the Allegations contained in the Petition of Joseph Williams of Ann-Arundel County, Planter, praying Leave to bring in a Bill to cut off the Entail of Two Hundred Acres part of a Tract of Land called Williams's Range containing Four Hundred and Twelve Acres, lying in Prince George's County.

Our Committe do find a Grant from the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary, bearing Date the 14th of Sept. 1737, to Richard Snowden for the Land mentioned in the faid Petition called Snowden's

Search containing 133 Acres.

Your Committee also do find a Grant for the Land mentioned in the said Petition called Plumpion bearing Date the 26th Day of June, Anno Dom. 1663, unto George Walker, containing 280 Acres, 100 Acres whereof by several mesne Conveyances (and by the Last Will and Testament of Gabriel Parrett, late of Anne-Arundel County, Deceased) is now become the Right of the said Richard Snowden in Fee.

Your Committee likewise further find a Grant to the said Snowden, bearing Date the 16th Day of November 1726, for the Land mentioned
