**T**HE House met according to Adjournment, &c. All Members present as on Saturday, Except Mr. Joseph Hall, Mr. Osborn Sprigg, Mr. Thomas Hammond, and Mr. Henry Hall. Mr. John Brome appeared in the House.

The Bill Entituled, *An Act for laying out and erecting a Town, on the South Side of the Eastern Branch of Potomock River, in Prince George's County, near a Place called Garrison-Landing*, was Read the Second Time, and will pass: Sent to the Upper House by Mr. Magruder and Mr. Wootton.

Samuel Chamberlain, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill Entituled, *A Supplementary Act to the Act Entituled; An Act for the Relief of Debtors, and ascertaining the Manner of Tenders in Tobacco, and to the Supplementary Act thereto*; Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, October 18, 1742. Read the Second Time, and will not pass.

James Harris, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill Entituled, *A Supplementary Act to the Act Entituled, An Act for repairing the Damages already sustained in the Records of the Land, Secretary's, Commissary's, and County-Court Offices; and for Security of the same Records for the Future*: Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, October 18, 1742. Read the Second Time, and will pass.
