*Edmund Fenings*, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill Entituled, *An Act to divide Prince George's County, &c.* Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, *October 25, 1742.* Read the Second Time, and will pass, with the following Amendments. In 1st Line of Page 2. instead of the Words *on, or near, a Tract of Land, called Buck-Lodge, on a Draught, or Branch of Seneca Creek;* put these Words, *at such Place as the Commissioners hereafter mentioned, or the major Part of them, shall think proper:* Alter the Word *Griffin*, in 6th Line of the same Page, put *William Beatty and Van Sweringer:* in 8th Line of the same Page, the Words, *The Tract of Land called Buck-Lodge, aforesaid,* to be left out, and the following inserted, *some convenient Place in the said County:* Between the Words *Griffin* and *or,* in 17th Line of the same Page, put these Words, *William Beatty and Van Sweringer:* Instead of the Words, *Two Hundred and Fifty,* in 12th Line of Page 3. put *Five Hundred.*
