Col. Henry brings in a Bill, Entiruled, An Act to encourage the Des froying of Bears in Worcester County; which was Read the First Time, and Ordered to lie on the Table.

The Petition of the Magistrates, and others, of St. Mary's County, praying Leave to bring in a Bill, to raise a Sum of Money on the taxable Inhabitants of the said County, to build a Work-house; Read and Granted.

The Petition of the Justices, and other Inhabitants of Prince George's County, praying Leave to bring in a Bill to raise a Sum, not exceeding Two Thousand Pounds, Current Money, to build a Court-House; Read and Granted.

Philip Thomas, Esq; from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill Entituled, An Ast for raising Four Pence Sterling per House on Assembly, all Tohacco exported, &c. Indorted, "By the Upper House of Assembly, May 9, 1744; Read the Second Time, and will pass, with the following amendments: After the Word raised, in the last Line but one of the first Page, to the End of the Bill, to be lest out, and the sollowing "Clauses inserted;

"Which said Duty shall be disposed of for the purchasing of Arms and Ammunition, for the maintaining a Magazine, for the better Defence of this Province, and for the due Preservation thereof; and paid to the Treasurer, or Treasurers of this Province, for the Time being, who shall be allowed Iwo and a Half per Cent. for the Receipt and Payment thereof; and to be disposed of to the Uses aforesaid, as the Governor and Council, for the Time being, shall direct; for the Collection where of, the Naval Officers shall be allowed the Salary of Eight per Cent." and no more.

"And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the seve"ral and respective Treasurers shall, from time to time, make and ren"der to both Houses of Assembly of this Province, sufficient and clear
"Accounts, of what Money they shall receive by Virtue of this Ast, and
"bow the same shall have been disposed of.

"This Act to continue to the Twenty-fifth Day of December, which " shall be in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred Forty " and Five, and no longer. Signed per Order, J. Rojs, Cl. Up. Ho."

James Hollyday, Eig; from the Upper Houle, delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill Entituled, An Ast for the Benefit of the Poor, and Encouragement of Industry, Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, May 5, 1744, "Read the Eirst Time, and Ordered to lie on the Table." And further Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, May 9, 1744, Read the "Second Time, and will pass. Signed per Order, J. Ross, Cl. Up. Ho."

Which Bill was here Read, and passed for Ingrossing.

Mr. Wootton brings in a Bill Entituled, An Act to divide Prince George's County, and to erect a new County on the upper Part thereof; which was Read the First Time, and ordered to lie on the Table.
