May it please your Honours, May 9, 1744. A Fter the most serious Consideration had, upon the Amendments you proposed to the Bill Entituled, An Act for raising Four Pente Sterling per Hogsbead, on all Tohacco to be exported, for purchasing Arms and Ammunition for the Defence of this Province; we cannot agree to any of them, nor other Alteration, than the reducing the Commission which is to be paid to Col. Edward Sprigg, to Two and Half fer Cont. being well fatisfied that the said Bill, in the Form we fent it up to your Honours, contains every Thing necessary for his Majesty's Service, and the Security of the Province, agreeable to the Intention thereof: And therefore, from a Fondnels which we have, that the said Bill should pass into a Law, return it to your Honours again, and hope the Bill will meet your Approbation, and pals your House accordingly.
