YOUR Committee having carefully inspected the State of the Office for emitting the Paper-Money, find (by counting the same), that there remains of the 89990 l. a Ballance in the Iron Chest, as in the annex'd Account, of 7735 l. 10 s.

That we have examined the 24 Books of unsigned Bills, amounting to 9687 l. 10 s. mentioned in the Report of May 10, 1740. to be for the Renewment and making good Torn and defaced Bills, and find now remaining of the same, after such Renewment made, as underneath; viz.
