An Ingrossed Bill entituled, *An Act for laying out the Town a new, commonly called Upper Marlborough Town, in Prince George's County,* and an Ingrossed Bill entituled, *An Act empowering the Vestry-men and Church-Wardens in King George's Parish, in Prince George's County, to purchase three Acres of Land in the said Parish, to build a Chapel of Ease on, and to empower the Justices of Prince George's County to levy on the taxable Inhabitants of the said Parish, in the said County, the Sum of Eight Hundred Pounds Current Money, for the Uses therein mentioned;* were severally Read and Assented to, and sent to the Upper House, with the Paper-Bills, by Mr. Wootton and Mr. Tho. Hammond.

An Address to the Governor, in Answer to his Message of the 25th Instant, being brought in; the Question was put, Whether this House approves thereof? *Resolved* in the Affirmative.
