On Motion of a Member, that the two Letters containing the Demand of the Six Nations of *Indians*, referred to in the Address to the Governor, be inserted in the Journal; Ordered, That they be inserted: The two Letters following thus, *viz.*

N<sup>o</sup> 1. " **W**E, the Chiefs of the Six Nations of *Indians*, the *Onan-*  
 " *dagoes, Istanudowans or Sinekas, Cayooges, Onadas,*  
 " *Tascororoës* in behalf of the *Canyingoes or Mohawks*, do hereby be-  
 " seech our Brethren \* *Onas* and *James Logan*, to write in our behalf  
 " to the Governor or Owner of the Land in *Maryland*, and to the Go-  
 " vernor of *Virginia*, to let them both know, that we expect some Con-  
 " sideration for our Land now in their Occupation, and if so be that they  
 " are willing to make some Consideration, let them leave the same with  
 " our Brethren in *Philadelphia* where we have a Fire burning, and if  
 " they have any thing to say to the contrary, we will hear them at the  
 " said Fire, if they will come there.

" We desire further of our Brethren *Onas* and *James Logan*, to let us  
 " know in as short a Time as possible the Answer of the Two Chief Men,  
 " one living in *Annapolis* and the other in *Virginia*, if so be that the  
 " Chief Man of *Annapolis* and the Chief Man of *Virginia* do neglect to  
 " make us any Consideration for our said Land, we desire our Brethren  
 " *Onas* and *James Logan* to let the Great King over the great Sea know  
 " of it, but notwithstanding let us know as soon as possible the Answer  
 " of both.

The Substance of what was said by *Canassateego*, Chief of the *Onon-*  
*dagues*, relating to the Governor of *Maryland*, at a Treaty held  
 with the Six Nations at *Philadelphia*, on the 7th of July 1742.

" Brethren,

N<sup>o</sup> 2. " **W**E have further to observe with respect to the Lands lying  
 " on the West side of *Susquehanna*, that tho' Brother  
 " *Onas* (meaning the Proprietor) has paid us for what his People possess;  
 " yet some Parts of that Country have been taken up by Persons whose  
 " Place of Residence is to the South of this Province, from whom we have  
 " never received any Consideration. This Affair was recommended to  
 " you by our Chiefs at our last Treaty; and you then at our earnest De-  
 " sire, promised to write a Letter to the Person who has the Authority

\* *Onas* the Name they always give to our Proprietors, the Word signifying a Pen in their Lan-  
 guage: And *J. Logan* has for above these 30 Years past been particularly concerned in all the  
 Negotiations with those People.

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
