There ever was a more pressing Occasion for our putting ourselves in a Posture of Defence, than at this critical Juncture; when a War is declared by the French against our Sovereign, and that the French are numerous and well disciplined on this Continent, and want neither Skill nor Industry to stir up the Indians against his Majesty's Subjects: We hope you will consider these I hings with the Attention they deserve, that they will have their due weight with your and that you will be of Opinion, that the best Proof you can possible give of your Loyalty to his Sacred Majesty, and Regard for the Security and Welfare of your Constituents, will be, to come into such measures, as self-preservation seems to us plainty to distate, wherein you may depend on our hearty Concurrence.

WE acknowledge your Favour in acquainting this House with the Deficiency before your Arrival, in the Money allow'd by Act of Assembly for Building a Governor's House, and we hope for your good Offices in having it communicated to this House in what manner the said Money

was expended.

And we beg leave to inform your Excellency, that in compliance with your Desire, we passed a Bill for raising Nine Hundred Pounds, for prosecuting the Building aforesaid, in such manner as would best suit the People of this Province, and as we conceive, would have been essential for the Purpose; but the said Bill was returned to us by the Upper House with a Negative.
