in your Address. That they should his all imaginable findeavours to prevent the ladians from insisting on a greater from than the People can well foare; and also, to avert the Gonsequences which you so justly apprehend from their Resement, if they should be disappointed.

As to what you mention of allowing the Commissioners their necessary travelling Charges only, I am concerned your Warmth has transported you mro this unneclury Declaration; fince it may give Suspicion, you deligned by the Seantinels and Meannels of the Allowance, to discourage a Treaty, and that you rather wished a War than a Peace with the dedians; but as your former Address not only allows a further Sum, without Limitation, for the Expences and Charges of the faid Commissioners, but Incessed the Fund out of which it is to be paid, you must excuse me, if I think, this Counter Declaration cannot restrain or limit what was intended by vour former Addreis: I may lasely appeal to all the sensible and unprijidiced Part of Mankind, whether your attempting (as you do by y ar Addres) to put those, who shall be empowered to treat with the lasdidus, under Difficulties; and your Backwardness in furnishing the Country with the Means of it's necessary Desence, can be reconciled to the great Professions you make of your Loyalty to his Majesty, and Regard to the Preservation of the Pcople you represent.

I shall (as in my former Message) appoint such Commissioners, as a moderate will conform to my Directions only; and notwithstanding what vouslay, you are obliged to tell me to the contrary, I make not the least Doubt, but they will conclude their Negotiation, not only with Honour to themselves, but, as sar as depends on them, with Advantage to the Province,
