PON Perusal of the Journal of Accounts, we find the several Omissions and wrong Allowances following, viz.

of Accounts, amounting to 30560 lb. Tobacco, we find you have only allowed the quantity of 21810 lb. Tobacco; nor can we conceive any just Reason for disallowing any Part of the whole quantity of 30060, except the two Articles of 120 lb. Tobacco each, for the Death Warrants of John Lillingston and William Hill, for which the Masters of those Servants may be liable.

adly. We are informed your Committee in the last Session resulted to allow 1440 lb. Tobacco, due to the late Governor Ogle, for 12 Procla-

mations concerning the furplus Lands.

3dly. You have not made Allowances of the Charges and Expences so necessarily incurred for the Preservation of the Peace and Sasety of the Province in Discovery and Preventing the ill Consequences of the late Indian Conspiracy in Dorset and Somerset Counties.

4thly. We do not find you have allowed the late Attorney-General his Fees due for the Profecution of several Criminals in 1737, amounting to

28000 lb. Tobacco, and 2000 lb. Tobacco fince.

stbly. There is no Allowance to the Secretary for Fees due to him on the Protecution of the said Criminals, amounting to 21250 lb. Tobacco; nor have you allowed the said Secretary his Fees due on the Conviction of Basnett and Condolly, nor does any Reason appear why you have deducted the quantity of 1641 lb. Tobacco from his other Fees.

6thly. There are several Accounts laid before this House by the Printer, and sent now to your House, which we hope you will think proper to allow.

7tbly. We send you two Accounts due to Mr. Ro/s, Clerk of the Council and this House, for public Services, the one for 3033th. Tobacco, and the other for a Balance of 1201.75.9d. Currency, which we doubt not you will think reasonable to allow.
