Mr. Worthington, from the Committee of Accounts, delivers the fol-

lowing Report, viz.

By the Committee of Accounts. June 2, 1744. VOUR Committee having inspected the Accounts Current, from Messieurs Samuel Hyde, William Hunt, and Robert Cruiksbank, Trustees in Great-Britain (from the Year 1736, to April 1743,) of the Fifteen Pence per Hogshead raised for the Sinking Fund of the Paper Currency, and the Naval Officers Accounts relating thereto, do find, that several Naval Officers have Charged the Province of Maryland with the following Bills remitted to the faid Trustees, which the said Trustees have not Credited the fair Province for, viz.

1737. Henry Morgan's Bill on Lyde and Cooper, for 171.165. remit-

ted by George Plater, Eig; Naval Officer of Patument.

Catharine Playfay's ditto Indorled by Henry Macer, for 10 1. remitted by Philip Lee, Esq; Naval Officer of North-Potomack.

1738. John Boyd's ditto, Indoised by John Brown, for 131.175. 1 d.

remitted by ditto.

1740. John Dormant's ditto, Indorsed by Robert Yates, for 531.11 s. and 8 d. remitted by ditto.

1741. James Mollinson's ditto, Indorsed by Robert Brown, for 251. 145. remitted by ditto.

1737. Levin Gale, Esq; Naval Officer of Pocomoke, on Neal Buchan-

nan, for 651. 14s. 4d. 2q remitted by himself. 1738, Ditto on ditto, for 711.3 s. 1 d. 2 q. remitted by ditto.

1739. Ditto on ditto, for 741.2 s. 6 d. remitted by ditto.

1740. Ditto on ditto, for 991. 145.4d.2q. remitted by ditto.

1741. Randolph Johnson's ditto on Buchannan, for 41.05.6d. remitted by Philip Lee, Elq; Naval Officer of North Potomack.

Your Committee observe, that there is no Account from the said Naval Officer of North Potomack, for the Duty of 15d. per Hogshead since

the 29th September 1742.

Your Committee further observe, that the said Trustees have Charged the said Province for Noting and Protesting Bills of Exchange from the 16th July 1734 to 1740, the Sum of 131.75.8d. which said Sum your Committee cannot find accounted for by the Navil Officers, and are informed the constant practice of the several Naval Officers are to order their Correspondents in Loudon, to pay any Bills they shall remit on the account of the 15 d. per Hogshead, on their own Accounts, and return the same Bills to them if Protested, in order to take to themselves the Damages arising on such Protests.

Your Committee also observe, that the said Trustees have Credited the Province on the 2d of May 1738, with Samuel Chew's Exchange on Hyde for 101. And on the 9th Day of May 1741, with William Graham's Exchange on Hicks and Gilpin for 291 16s, which Bills not being charged to the Province in any Naval Officer's Account, your Committee humbly
