*Resolved*, That the said Dr. *George Stuart*, Returned as a Citizen and Delegate for the City of *Annapolis*, is not duly Elected. And,

*Ordered*, That Mr. Speaker acquaint him, that he is Dismissed from any farther Attendance in this House: Which he does accordingly.

*Resolved* unanimously, That Mr. *Stephen Bordley* is duly Elected a Member for the City of *Annapolis*.

*The House adjourns to Monday Morning 9 of the Clock.*
