the Governor and Council on the Taxable Inhabitants of this Province, Rejobved unanimously, That the Levying the same is Illegal and Oppressive.

And Ordered, That an Address be prepared to his Excellency, on the Subject Matter of that Message, and that the Committee of Laws prepare and bring in the same.
