THE House met according to Adjournment, and the Proceedings of Yesterday were read.

The Bill, entitled, *An Act for ascertaining the Allowance of Petit Jurors attending the Provincial Court, and to limit Costs with respect to Evidence;* was Read the First and Second Time, by especial Order, Passed, and sent to the Upper House by Mr. George Wilson, and Mr. Mackall.

A Bill, entitled, *An Act to divide Prince George's County, and to erect a new one by the Name of Frederick County;* was Read the First and Second Time, by especial Order, Passed, and sent to the Upper House by Mr. Wootton, and Capt. Ennalls.

A Bill, entitled, *An Act to divide Dorchester and Queen-Anne's Counties, and to erect a new County out of the upper Parts thereof, by the Name of Prince-William County;* was Read the First and Second Time, by especial Order, Passed, and sent to the Upper House by Mr. Pemberton, and Capt. Hopper.

Col. Lloyd, from the Upper House, delivers Mr. Speaker the Bill, entitled, *An Act to direct and empower the Clerk of Prince George's County, to enter and record among the Records of the said County, a Deed of Bargain and Sale from John Neville, &c.* Indorsed, "By the Upper House of Assembly, Sept. 24. 1745.
