THE House met according to Adjournment: And the Proceedings of
Yesterday were Read.

The Bill, entituled, *An Act for Limitation of Officers Fees*, was Read,
with the Amendments proposed by the Upper House, and passed for In-
grossing.

The House, upon inspecting the Account of *Philip Lee*, Esq; Naval-Of-
ficer of *North-Potomack*, for the Duty of 15 d. per Hogshead by him col-
lected, between the 29th of September, 1743, and the 31st of March, 1744,
as rendered by his Executor Mr. *Thomas Lee*, finding that the Probate there-
on indorsed, is not in the usual manner; Ordered, That the Clerk write to
the said *Thomas Lee*, to render the aforesaid Account at the next Session of
Assembly, with a Probate made thereto in the usual Form.

The Chairman of the Committee of Accounts lays before the House, the
Account of *Charles Hammond*, Esq; Treasurer of the Western Shore; and
there being an Article of 6l. 5 s. charged in the said Account for Commission
on 250 l. Sterling, received by the said Treasurer from Mr. *Matthias Gale*,
acting Executor of Col. *Levin Gale*, The Question was put, Whether the
House doth approve of that Article? Resolved in the Negative.
