Upon Consideration of the Amendments proposed by the Upper House to the Bill, entituled, An Ast to divide Prince George's County, &c. and to the Bill, entituled, An Ast to divide Dorchester and Queen-Anne's, &c. Resolved, That this House will not agree to the said Amendments.

By the Lower House of Assembly, September 26, 1745.

May it please your Honours,

When the two following Bills, viz. a Bill entituded, An Ast to divide Prince George's County, and to erest a new one by the Name of Frederick County; and a Bill entituded, An Ast to divide Dorchester and Queen Anne's Counties, and to erest a new one out of the upper Parts thereof by the Name of Prince William County: And as we cannot, consistent with our Duty, introduce a Precedent unknown in the Manner of passing our Laws within this Province, so we cannot agree to the Amendments proposed by your House. But as we are sensible that the People greatly want and desire those Bills to take trace as Laws, we are willing to lengthen the Time in them respectively mentioned, to the 29th Day of September, 1747; and hope your Honours will agree with us therein.
