May it please your Excellency,

UPON Examination and Report made by a Committee appointed by this House there appears to be due to the Public, on the following two Acts of Assembly, viz. An Act for issuing and paying out of the Office of the Commissioners or Trustees for emitting Bills of Credit, established by Act of Assembly, the Sum of 2562 l. 10s. Current Money; in Bills of Credit; to be applied for the Encouragement of Persons voluntarily enlisting themselves in his Majesty's Service; and an Act entitled, An Act for raising and issuing Money for maintaining his Majesty's Forces to be raised in this Province, and for transporting them to the Place of Rendezvous in the West Indies; from the respective Sheriffs mentioned in the Accounts hereunto annexed, the Sum of Three Hundred and Fourteen Pounds, Five Shillings, and One Farthing, in different Years.
