That the said Will, and many others, (as the said Mr. White, who was many Years Deputy Clerk of Baltimore County, affirms,) are entered or register'd in the faid County.

That an Act of Allembly was made in the Year 1692, to aid Defects in judicial Proceedings, which

cannot by any Construction reach Mr. White's Cafe, or any of the inse Nature.

The faid Commissary General therefore, conceiving it to be this Dury to represent this Maries to the Consideration of the Legislature (which he would have done sooner, if he had discovered it), humbly submits, Whether some Provision ought not to be made for securing the Rights of Purchasers under Wills, warred may have been entered on the County Court Records, altho' not reguler'd on the Office appointed by Law, for that Purpole. There are some other Years, besides those above mentioned, wherein there are no Registry. March 19, 1745-6.
