

And that the Sum of £. 100. 0. 0. Sterling be taken out of the hands of Mr. William Hunt Merchant in London and be transmitted to New York for purchasing Bread for the Soldiers. Ordered that the Committee of Laws prepare and bring in a Bill accordingly.

The house Adjourns untill the Morrow Morning at 9. of the Clock Saturday Morning Nov. 8th 1746. The house met according to Adjournment. The proceedings of Yesterday were Read. Col. Henry appeared in the house. Mr Daniel Sullivan a Member returned to serve for Dorchester County appeared in the house. Capt. Enalls and Mr Thomas were sent to the Upper house to see him qualified. They return acquaint Mr Speaker they saw him qualified by taking the several Oaths to the Government required by Law signing the oath of Abjuration repeating and signing the Test. The Gentleman took his seat in the house.

The house taking into Consideration the Accounts of Benjamin Tashor Esq. and Doctor Charles Carroll two of the Agents for providing for and Transporting the Soldiers raised in this province to the place of Rendezvous on Examination find them right and Unanimously approve of the Conduct and Management of those Gentlemen in relation thereto and Resolved that the Agents appointed for the aforesaid Uses be allowed £. 100. 0. 0. for their Trouble and that there be a Clause for that purpose inserted in the Bill now preparing by the Committee of Laws. On reading the petition and Complaint of Doctor Carroll The Question was put Whether this house shall Address the Governour on the Subject Matter of the said Complaint, Or Not.
