May it please your Honor It appearing to this House that Paper and Parchment is wanting for the use of the publick and as there is a Balance remaining in the hands of the Ex^{ts} of Col: Samuel Young of £. 13. 16. 8. in Current Gold due on the Duty of Twenty Shillings Sterling & head on Irish Papists on Negroes Imported into this Province

We propose That that Balance be taken out of the said Ex^{ts} hands by an Order drawn on them payable to M^r Phillip Hammond who has undertaken to Convert that Sum into a Bill of Exchange and send to England for Paper and Parchment for the use of the publick to the Amount thereof if your Honor Concur therewith Signed & ordered

Was sent by Mess^{rs} Shorodino & John Grosham to the Upper house The Journal of Accounts was Read and Assented to and sent to the Upper house by M^r Worthington and the rest of the Gentlemen of the Committee of Accounts.
